

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1. Safety Instructions



Wi-Fi® CAMERA UNIT SET UP & USE:

- Determine a location for the Wi-Fi[®] Camera Unit that will provide the best view of the area you would like to monitor (ie back yard or front door).
- Fix the camera to a flat wall using the wall mounting plate and following the instructions provided.

WARNING

This Wi-Fi[®] Camera Unit is compliant with all relevant electromagnetic field standards and is, when handled as described in the User's Guide, safe to use. Therefore, always read the instructions in this User's Guide carefully before using the device.

- · Keep this user's guide for future reference.
- Do not cover the Wi-Fi® Camera Unit with a towel or blanket.
- Test the Wi-Fi[®] Camera Unit and all its functions so that you are familiar with it prior to use.
- Do not install the Wi-Fi® Camera Unit near a heat source.
- Only use the power adapter provided. Do not use other power adapters as this may damage the device.
- · Never use extension cords with power adapters.
- $\bullet\,$ Do not touch the plug contacts with sharp or metal objects.



3. Getting started - Connecting Devices

How does it work?



When a user tries to access the Camera, our secure server authenticates the user's identity and permits access to the Camera.

3.1 How to register your Camera to Hubble account

3.1.1 Setting Up the Camera



Via WIFI

- Step 1: Connect the antenna with the connector on the rear surface of the camera.
- Step 2: Insert the power adapter connector into the camera's power socket and screw in the waterproof cover. Connect the power adaptor plug to a suitable mains socket and wait for the LED to start blinking RED.



- Step 3: Press and hold the pair button for 3 seconds or more until both RED and GREEN LEDs blink together.
- Step 4: From the APP, press "+" camera to search for the Focus 72, then follow the instructions from the APP

Via LAN


- Step 1: Connect the LAN cable to the camera's LAN socket and the other end to your router, and screw in the waterproof cover.
- Step 2: Insert the power adapter connector into the camera's power socket and screw in the waterproof cover. Connect the power adaptor plug to a suitable mains socket and wait for the LED to start blinking RED.
- Step 3: Press and hold the pair button for 3 seconds or more until both RED and GREEN LEDs blink together.
- Step 4: From the APP, press "+" camera to search for the Focus72, then follow the instructions from the APP.

3.1.2 Install your Camera

NOTE: We recommend you set up your camera with your router and make sure that the camera operates fully with your Wi-Fi / LAN in the location you are going to mount it, before you start to drill holes for the installation.

A. Drill the Screw Holes

- Mark the position on the wall using the camera base plate as a template, making sure the cable guide in the base plate is correctly aligned for the direction you want the camera wires to leave the mounting, unless you pass them directly through the wall behind the base plate.
- Drill 3 holes (4.5mm diameter) and hammer the expansion plugs (included) into the holes as needed.
- If you want to pass the camera wires through the wall behind the base plate, drill a 22mm diameter hole in the midpoint between the screw holes.





B. Fixing the Camera unit to the wall or ceiling

- Pass the camera wires through the cable guide of the base plate or through a hole in the wall or ceiling directly behind the base plate.
- Fasten the base plate on the wall or ceiling with the 3 screws provided.
- · Make sure the unit is fixed firmly on the wall or ceiling.







C. Adjust angle and secure the camera unit

- · Loosen the tamper-proof screws with the wrench key (provided).
- Adjust the camera angles to give your required field of view, then tighten the tamper-proof screws.





D. Connecting LAN with the Camera Unit


 The LAN socket provides an option for you to connect directly via a LAN cable if necessary. Insert the LAN jack into the LAN socket through the water proof cover and fasten the cover, as shown.






3.1.3 How to assemble the waterproof plug for the LAN cable

Step 1: Place the O-Ring washer over the end of the LAN socket.



Step 2: Pass the LAN plug and cable through Part 1, the Rubber Gasket and Part 2 in the order shown below.



Rubber gasket, please clasp it around the cable and insert

Step 3: Connect the LAN plug into the LAN socket.



Step 4: Turn and lock Part 2 to the LAN socket.



Step 5: Make sure the Rubber Gasket is inserted into the rear of Part 2 and screw Part 1 to Part 2 to finalise the connection.



NOTE

If the LAN is not being connected, fit the waterproof blanking cap (provided) over the end of the camera's LAN socket.



3.1.4 Status of LED Indication:

Status	LED Behaviour
Power Up Initialising	GREEN and RED LED ON for around 5 sec Then GREEN LED ON for 10 sec
Connecting to Wi-Fi router	RED LED Blink every 2 sec
In pair mode after press & hold the Pair Button for 3sec	Both RED and GREEN LEDs blink together
During Video Streaming	The LED blinks GREEN every second
Connected to Server but without video streaming	The LED is on GREEN continuously
Connected to router previously but ping to Server failed	The LED blinks RED every second

Note: You can only setup via a compatible smartphone or tablet and not via a PC.



3.2 User Account and Camera Setup on Android™ Devices

What you need

- FOCUS72 Camera
- · Power adapter for the Camera
- Device with Android[™] system version 4.2 and above

3.2.1 Power ON and Connect the Camera

Connect the FOCUS72 power adapter to a suitable electrical outlet and insert the power adapter plug into the power socket. (see section 3.1.1 Setting Up the Camera, Step 2)

• The Camera's green LED blinks after the Camera has finished booting.

3.2.2 Download the Hubble App

- Go to Google Play™ Store to search for "Hubble for Motorola Monitors" application.
- Download "Hubble for Motorola Monitors" App from Google Play™ Store and install it on your Android™ device

3.2.3 Run Hubble for Motorola Monitors App on Android™ Devices

- Ensure that your AndroidTM device is connected to your Wi-Fi[®] router.
- Run "Hubble for Motorola Monitors" App, enter your account information, read through the Terms of Service, then select "I agree to the Terms of Use" before you tap Create. (Picture A1)

If you already have a Hubble App account, please select Already have an Account? to go to the next step.





3.2.4 Add the Camera to your account

• Tap • on the top right corner of the screen to add camera. (Picture A2)



• The following setup instructions will appear on the screen. (Picture A3)




- Plug in and switch on the camera, and wait for a couple of minutes for it to warm up.
- · Tap Continue.



• The following setup instructions will appear on the screen. (Picture A4)



- Press and hold the **PAIR** button on one of the wire leads from the Camera Unit for 3 seconds. The LED indicator on the Camera Unit will flash rapidly.
- · Tap Continue.
- The App will automatically search for and connect to your Camera as shown in the pictures below. (Pictures A5, A6).





 Select the same Wi-Fi[®] Network that your Android unit is connected to, enter your password and then tap Connect. (Pictures A7, A8)





- It will take a few minutes for the Camera to connect to the Wi-Fi[®] network before showing the connection status. (Pictures A9, A10)
- If connection fails, please tap Retry and repeat the steps starting from 3.2.4.





 Tap View Camera to view the video captured by the Camera Unit. The LED indicator on the Camera Unit will light up in green.



3.3 User Account and Camera Setup on iPhone $^{\rm @}$ /iPad $^{\rm @}$ What you need

- FOCUS72 Camera
- · Power adapter for the Camera
- iPhone[®] / iPad[®] with iOS version 7.0 and above

3.3.1 Power ON and Connect the Camera

Connect the FOCUS72 power adapter to a suitable electrical outlet and insert the power adapter plug into the power socket. (see section 3.1.1 Setting Up the Camera, Step 2)

• The Camera's green LED blinks after the Camera has finished booting.

3.3.2 Download the Hubble App

- Go to the App Store to search for "Hubble for Motorola Monitors" application.
- Download "Hubble for Motorola Monitors" App and install it on your iPhone[®]/iPad[®].

3.3.3 Run Hubble for Motorola Monitors App on iPhone®/iPad®

- Ensure that your iPhone[®]/iPad[®] is connected to your Wi-Fi[®] Router.
- Run the "Hubble for Motorola Monitors" App, enter your account information, read through the Terms of Service, and then select "I agree to the Terms of Service" before you tap Create. (Picture i1)

If you already have a Hubble App account, please select Already have an Account? to go to the next step (Picture i1).





3.3.4 Add the Camera to your account

- Tap on the top right corner of the screen to add camera. (Picture i2)
- The following setup instructions will appear on the screen. (Picture i3).





- Wait for a couple of minutes for the Camera Unit to warm up and tap Continue.
- The following will appear on the screen. (Pictures i4, i5)







• Name the location of your Camera Unit and tap Continue. (Pictures i6, i7)

• The Camera Unit will search for the Wi-Fi® network (Picture i8) and display a list of available networks. (Picture i9)

- Select the same Wi-Fi $^{\circledR}$ Network that your iOS unit is connected to, and tap Continue. (Picture i10)
- Enter your Wi-Fi[®] password and tap **Next.** (Picture ill)

- It will take a few minutes for the Camera Unit to connect to the Wi-Fi® network before showing the connection status. (Pictures i12, i13)
- If connection fails, tap Retry and repeat the steps starting from 3.3.4.

• Tap **View Live Camera** to view the video captured by the Camera Unit. The LED indicator on the Camera Unit will light up in green.



4. App menu

≡	Menu	 Tap Cameras to access the camera list. Tap Event Log to access the video record list that is triggered by Motion detection. Tap Account to access user Profile, subscription Plan, Notifications setting, Remote Connection Setting and About Hubble. 	
®	Photo/Video	 Hubble. Take a photo or record a video from your Camera. Tap the Video icon to activate Video function. Tap and hold the red button to start recording and release to stop. Tap the Camera icon to switch to Camera mode. You can capture photos from Camera view. Note: Photos and videos will be stored in the internal flash memory of your smart device, and can be accessed via the Gallery or Media Player (Android Device). To play videos, please use the Hubble App. 	
(Q)	Zoom	Slide the scroll bar on the right hand side of the screen to zoom in or zoom out. You can also use the pinch-in and pinch-out gestures to zoom out or zoom in a picture. To use pinch-to-zoom gesture, your device must support multi-touch technology.

5. Working with PC/Notebook

- · Go to URL: https://app.hubbleconnected.com/#login
- Enter your User Name and Password and then click Login if you have already created an account.
- Click on the Camera list paired in your account via AndroidTM device or iPhone[®]/iPad[®], and the Camera view will appear on screen. You can easily stay connected with your favorite people, places and pets with live video streaming.
- On the website, you can change the settings by following the Menu instruction steps.



6. Help

Noise interference

Use of other 2.4 GHz products, such as BluetoothTM systems or microwave ovens, may cause interference with this product. Keep the Wi-Fi $^{(\!R\!)}$ Camera Unit at least 5ft away from these types of products, or turn them off if they appear to be causing interference.

Lost connection

Check your Wi-Fi $^{(\!R\!)}$ settings. If necessary reconnect your Wi-Fi $^{(\!R\!)}$. Ensure the Wi-Fi $^{(\!R\!)}$ Camera Unit is switched ON. Wait a few minutes to make the connection with the Wi-Fi $^{(\!R\!)}$ system.

If you forgot your password

If you do not remember your password, tap Forgot password and submit your e-mail address. A new password will be sent to your e-mail address immediately.

Troubleshooting

Category	Problem Description / Error	Solution
Account	I am unable to login even after registration.	Please check your user name and password.
Account	I receive an error messagesaying: "Email ID is not registered".	Please ensure that you have registered with us. Tap Create Account to create an account tobe able to use the Wi-Fi [®] Home Video Camera.

Account	What do I do if I forgot my password?	Click on the "Forgot Password" link on the https://app. hubbleconnected.com/ #lostpassword website OR your Android TM or iOS application. An email will be sent to your registered email address.	
Account	I am unable to receive a new password although I have used the "Forgot password" option.	The e-mail might have been sent to your Junk Mail Folder. Please check your Junk Mail Folder. There might be a delay in getting your e-mail. Please wait a few minutes and refresh your email account.	
Connectivity Issues	I get a message: We are having problems accessing your camera. This could be due to lack of internet connection. Please wait and try again later.	Please try again in a few minutes. This could be because of any issue with your internet connection. If the problem remains, please restart your Camera to check if this fixes the problem. Please restart your Wireless Router.	
Viewing Camera	When I am in "remote mode", the video stops after 5 minutes. How do I view for longer?	When you are accessing your Camera via a network different from your home network (over internet) your video times out after 5 minutes. You can click on the Camera again from the Android TM/iOS application to start streaming again. If you are accessing from your webrowser, then you can press on the Reload button to start viewing your Camera video stream again.	



Connectivity Issues	My Phone application displays the following message: "Unable to connect to BMS server".	Check the Wi-Fi® network strength. Check if you are connected to the internet by starting the phone browser and going to a website like www.google.com. Try again if you are successful connecting to the internet. Plug the LAN wire into RJ45 socket directly and connect to the internet in case the Wi-Fi® signal is not good.
Setting Up	While I am adding a new camera to my account, I am not able to find any Cameras to add.	If you are trying to add a Camera which has previously been added into your account or another account, you will first have to reset the Camera. This can be done by pressing and holding the PAIR button on one of the wire leads from the Camera for 3 seconds.
General	What are the supported browsers for accessing from my PC/ Mac?	On PC and Mac, we recommend to use Google Chrome. However the following browsers are also supported: PC: Internet Explorer® 9 and above. Mac: Safari® 6.
Connectivity issues	I found interference caused by my other web cam devices.	Video streaming performance is related to internet bandwidth, especially if you have 2 or more video streaming devices that are working through the same router.



General	What is the significance of LED flashing?	A blinking LED indicates the following status: Rapid blinking: 1. Your Camera is in setup mode. You can add the Camera to your account in this mode. Out of the box, the Camera is in setup mode. To reset to setup mode, press and hold the PAIR button on one of the wire leads from the Camera until the LED indicator flashes rapidly. Slow blinking: 2. The Camera is either connecting to the router or lost the link to the router. Please ensure that the Camera is in the Wi-Fi [®] signal range. LED is stable: The Camera is connected to the Wi-Fi [®] network.
Connectivity Issues	I am not able to access my Camera.	Please check if the Camera is within Wi-Fi $^{\mathbb{R}}$ range. If the LED on your Camera is slow blinking, please try to move the Camera closer to the router for better Wi-Fi $^{\mathbb{R}}$ range and try again.
Setting Up	During setup on device for Android™ and iOS, during the last step lam not able to find my Camera and the setup fails.	Please reset the Camera to setup mode and try again. Press and hold the PAIR button on one of the wire leads from the Camera until you hear a beep. The LED indicator flashes rapidly, indicating that it is in setup mode. Now restart the setup from your Smartphone again.



Connectivity Issues	Even though I am accessing my Camera from the same Wi-Fi® network, I still find my Camera is shown as remote. I can only access it for 5 minutes at a time.	Please check your wireless router settings. For example, in Buffalo brand routers there is an option called Wireless Isolation. Please disable this option.
Camera	When I try to view the Camera, I get a prompt for Camera firmware upgrade. What should I do?	Please upgrade your firmware. This takes around 5 minutes. We push upgrades from time to time to improve the Camera features.
General	Which platforms are supported for accessing my Camera?	Windows® 7*, Windows® 8* *Java browser plug-in needed Mac OS® version 10.7 or above Internet Explorer® version 9 or above Firefox® version 18 or above Chrome™ version 24 or above Safari® version 6 or above Java™ version 7 or above Android™ version 4.2 or above iPhone®/iPad® iOS version 7.0 or above.
General	What is the meaning of "Local Camera" and "Remote Camera"?	When you are accessing your camera from the same wireless network (Home) in which it is configured, it is a local camera. When you are accessing your Camera away from your home it is a remote camera. You may be using 3G, 4G or 4G LTE or a Wi-Fi® connection outside of your home.
